The following list of medications has been specifically requested by the HOI Medical Committee as the most used in the HOI clinics. The committee requests that teams who donate medications concentrate resources and focus on donating these medications only which will ensure that our clinics have a continuous supply.

Prescriptives

Amoxicillin, suspension
Anti-hypertensives: Atenolol,
Furosemide (Lasix)
Anti-diabetic: Metformin, Glibenclamide
Medicine to treat coughs and flu
Phenobarbital 100 mg
Anticonvulsants: Emamin 100 mg or
equivalent Phenytoin
Amitriptyline or equivalent 25 mg
Oral contraceptives
Anti fungal creams / ointments
Antibiotics for adults (Cipro, Bactrim,
Septra)

OTCs

Liquid & tablet acetaminophen
Ibuprofen, liquid & suspension
Medicine to treat coughs and flu
Neosporin, Triple antibiotic and
equivalents
Anti fungal creams / ointments
Hydrocortisone cream
Multi vitamins for adults and children,
also with iron supplements
Pediatric vitamin suspensions
Prenatal vitamins with iron
Folic Acid tablets
Ferrous Sulfate, iron tablets
Mylanta, Tums or similar

**** Medical supplies and pharmaceuticals that will be imported as donations into Honduras must be registered with customs officials and the Ministry of Health. Failure to register pharmaceuticals could result in confiscation or delayed passage through Honduran Customs. We have included the following form for your convenience.**
